

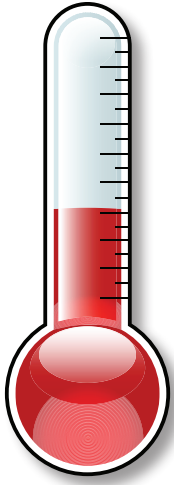

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Chronic Conditions

Chronic conditions are those that last more than a year, including physical diseases and mental conditions.

Compared with other individuals, those with three or more chronic conditions have higher health care costs and live 5.3 fewer years [20]. Lifestyle factors such as tobacco use, insufficient physical activity, poor diet, and excessive alcohol consumption contribute significantly to chronic conditions. Chronic conditions for this measure include Alzheimer's Disease and related dementia, heart failure, arthritis, hepatitis, asthma, HIV/AIDS, atrial fibrillation, high cholesterol, autism spectrum disorder, high blood pressure, cancer, ischemic heart disease, chronic kidney disease, osteoporosis, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, schizophrenia and other psychotic disorders, depression, stroke, and diabetes.

Data for this measure are based on enrollment and claims data for Medicare fee-for-service beneficiaries from 2007 to 2015 [19].



Civic Engagement

Communities that offer opportunities to work together and affect change (such as philanthropy, community partnerships, or volunteering) help bring a neighborhood together through civic engagement. Another example of civic engagement is voting in elections; voting is one of the strongest ways we can show we care about our community, state, and nation. Older adults have the highest voter turnout of any age group.

Data for this measure are derived using the number of older adult voters during the 2016 presidential election as measured by the election commission, as well as the 2017 population projections from the Boyd Center for Business & Economic Research [1, 17]



Demographic Data

Demographic data contained within this document are used for informational purposes to provide a broad overview of some of the characteristics of our communities' older adults.

Data sources include the Boyd Center for Business & Economic Research, [1] the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury [15], the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services [12], and the United States Census Bureau [11, 13, 14]



Difficulty Walking

Walking is among the most common forms of physical activity engaged in by older adults, as either a leisure-time pursuit or a part of everyday activities. Difficulty with walking may in turn limit physical activity, leading to a decline in health. In addition, difficulty walking may also reduce an individual's access to goods, services, social networks, and community activities.

Data for this measure comes from the 2012-2016 data for the American Community Survey 5-year estimates [6]



Falls

Falls are the leading cause of fatal and nonfatal injuries in adults ages 65 and older. Such injuries may limit mobility, contribute to social isolation, and even cause premature death. The risk of falls and related injuries increases with age and is greatest after age 75. The Healthy People 2020 goal is 4.7% or fewer adults ages 65 and older having falls that result in an emergency department visit [21]. However, Tennessee has not yet reached this goal as approximately 7.3% of older Tennesseans had an emergency department visit due to a fall during 2015.

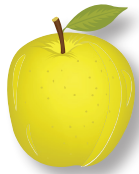
The data shown for this measure are from the Hospital Discharge Data System as retrieved from the Tennessee Department of Health, Division of Population Health Assessment, Office of Health Statistics [3].



Flu Shots

The influenza (flu) vaccine helps protect individuals against seasonal influenza virus, a contagious respiratory infection that can worsen long-term health problems and lead to complications such as pneumonia. Older adults are strongly encouraged to get vaccinated, as they are at an increased risk of contracting the virus and may suffer serious symptoms if infected. In fact, it is estimated that older adults account for between 71% and 85% of flu-related deaths and more than half of flu-related hospitalizations [16]. Many of these cases can be prevented with the influenza vaccine. Medicare and other insurances cover the full cost of one flu vaccination each year.

Data for this measure are based on claims only for Medicare fee-for-service (FFS) beneficiaries ages 65 and older during the 2017-2018 flu season [2].



Food Environment Index

The Food Environment Index ranges from 0 (worst) to 10 (best) and equally weights two indicators of the food environment:

1) Limited access to healthy foods estimates the percentage of the population that is low income and does not live close to a grocery store. Living close to a grocery store is defined differently in rural and nonrural areas; in rural areas, it means living less than 10 miles from a grocery store, whereas in nonrural areas it means less than 1 mile. "Low income" is defined as having an annual family income of less than or equal to 200% of the federal poverty threshold for the family size.

2) Food insecurity estimates the percentage of the population who did not have access to a reliable source of food during the past year. A two-stage fixed effects model was created using information from the Community Population Survey, Bureau of Labor Statistics, and American Community Survey.

Data for this measure comes from the County Health Rankings food environment index [8].



Grandparents Raising Grandchildren

When parents are absent or unable to raise their children, grandparents are often the ones who step in to help. Many grandparents express that the experience enhances their lives. However, many grandparents also express added stress from supporting their grandchildren, saving for retirement, and maintaining their own health while caring for their grandchild. Given these many factors, at least some grandparents who are responsible for raising their grandchildren are vulnerable mentally and physically, underscoring the importance of empowering them and ensuring access to services and supports when needed.

Data presented includes the number of grandparents responsible for raising their grandchildren and comes from the 2012-2016 data for the American Community Survey 5-year estimates [6].



Housing Cost Burdened

Housing is the single largest expense for older adults. Households that spend more than 30% of their income on housing are described as “housing-cost burdened.” Every additional dollar spent on housing costs and utilities takes away money from other needs such as food, health care, and transportation. This measure is an indicator for households that own and does not include renters, as over 80% of older Tennesseans are homeowners, with or without a mortgage. However, renters in this same age group tend to fare worse than owners. Being housing-cost burdened presents a particular problem for older Americans, who are more likely to be struggling to make ends meet.

Data for this measure comes from the 2012-2016 data for the American Community Survey 5-year estimates [9].

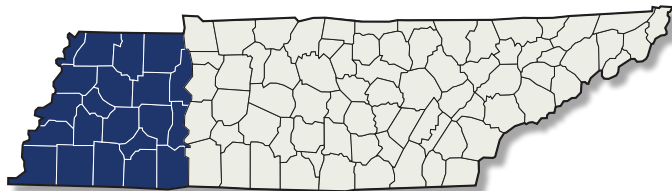


Poverty

Many seniors live on limited incomes and modest savings. Many individuals, especially those below 100% of the federal poverty limit, may struggle with the costs of housing and health care, healthy food, and reliable transportation. Poverty rates among older adults increase with age.

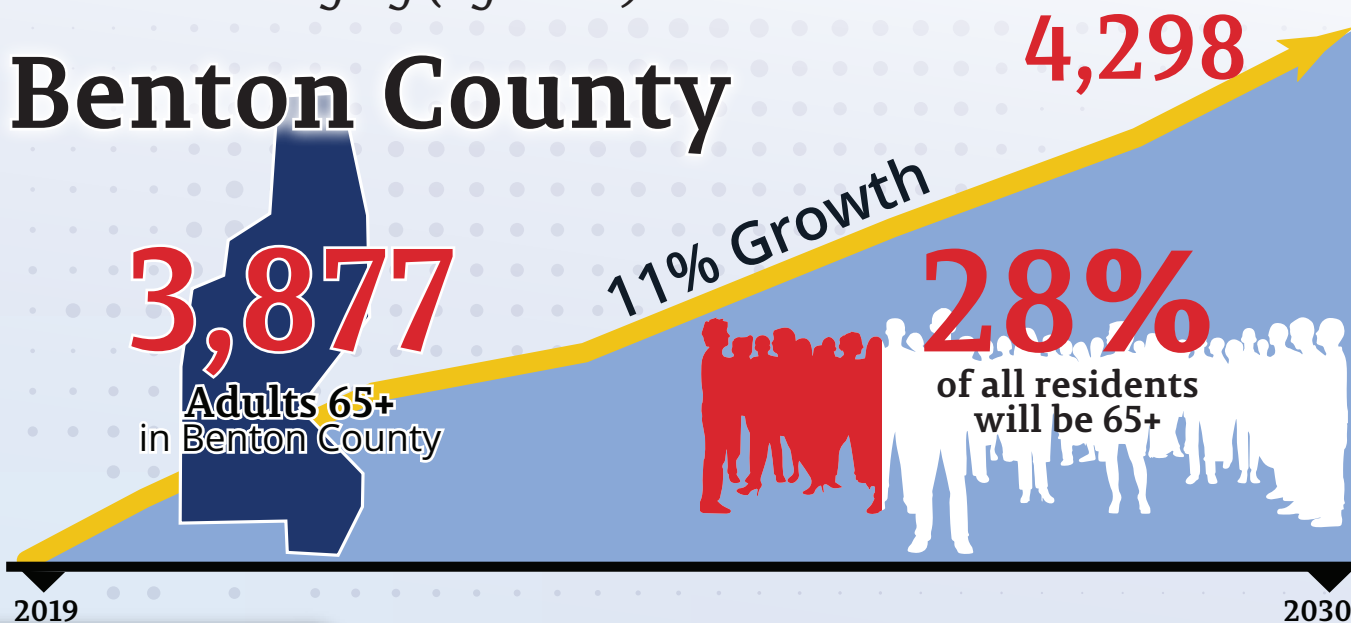
