

Let's Tell a Story!

Focus Area: Well-being

Description: Employees will work together to create a fun story.

Length of Activity: The length of this activity will be dependent on the number of individuals participating in the activity. If during an in-person or virtual meeting, this may take 10-20 minutes. If this is done virtually (on your own time) then it could be one to two weeks.

In-person and/or virtual: This activity can be conducted in-person or virtually.

Directions: Variations

In-person

- 1. For a larger group, divide employees into teams of five or less.
- 2. Each team will receive the list of "Words Needed" and have a set amount of time to come up with the list of words.
- 3. Each team will then receive the story and fill in the blanks with their list of words.
- 4. Teams will then read their stories aloud to one another.





Virtual (on your own time)

- 1. Using a Google Form (or some other method), collect the list of "Words Needed" from co-workers.
- 2. Create a story (or stories) using the collected words and share via email, create a video, etc.

Virtual meeting

- 1. This could be done during a team meeting, virtual coffee break, etc.
- 2. Host should have the list of "Words Needed" and the story.
- 3. Depending on the number of attendees, the host could ask for the required words via the chat and/or call on specific attendees.
- 4. The host will collect the "Words Needed" and then read the story aloud.

Helpful Tips for Let's Tell a Story:

- An ADJECTIVE describes something or somebody. Lumpy, soft, ugly, messy, and short are adjectives
- An ADVERB tells how something is done. It modifies a verb and usually ends in "ly." Modestly, stupidly, greedily and carefully are adverbs.
- A **NOUN** is the name of a person, place or thing. Sidewalk, umbrella, toy, bathtub and nose are nouns.
- A **VERB** is an action word. *Run, pitch, jump* and *swim* are verbs. Put the verbs in past tense if the directions say **PAST TENSE**. Ran, pitched, jumped and swam are verbs in the past tense.
- When asked for a **PLACE**, it means any sort of place: a country or city (Mexico, Oakland) or a room (bathroom, kitchen)
- An **EXCLAMATION** or **SILLY WORD** is any sort of funny sound, gasp, grunt or outcry, like Wow!, Ouch!, Ick! and Gadzooks!
- When asked for a **PLURAL**, it means more than one. For example, *door* pluralized is doors.
- When asked for specific words like a **NUMBER**, a **COLOR**, an **ANIMAL** or a **PART OF THE BODY**, it means a word that is one of those things, like *seven*, *green*, dog or mouth.
